

Leaders' Notes for Zoom meeting with Children's Groups

He is for us : Joshua and the land God promised Session 2 – He has plans for us

Zoom Procedure:

- Leaders join Zoom first, and are last out. There must be at least two DBS holding adults leading. If a leader fails to join, as long as the present leader has a DBS, let in a parent and ask them to stay until another leader arrives.
- Children must have a parent with them on screen when they enter the zoom call. This then signifies consent and will be made clear in emails containing the zoom link. The parent need not stay after that.
- The zoom call mustn't be recorded.
- In all other ways comply with the existing church safeguarding policy.

Zoom Plan:

Timing	Activity	Notes
0-10	<p>Welcome: Welcome question on powerpoint: What fun thing have you done this week? KS1 game: Memory game – what's missing? (one item is missing each time. What is it? KS2 game: Memory game – show items, then show blank screen whilst children list items. X3</p>	<p>Unmute all as children arrive – make visual contact with a parent. Then mute all and go round to hear children speak, unmuting one child at a time. Establish signal eg. hands up / hat on / finger on nose to speak during discussion.</p>
10-20	<p>Recap story: Recap story using cartoon or stills on powerpoint, followed by quick quiz on powerpoint: KS1: True / False answers – children show thumbs up or thumbs down. KS2: Children use coloured objects to register answers.</p>	
20-25	<p>Discussion: KS1: What would you like to do / be when you grow up? We have our own plans, and God has plans for us too – it says in the bible they are good plans. He knows us well enough to know exactly what we can do for His kingdom! KS2: What are your plans for your life? How did God's plans for Rahab work out? Do you think she would ever have thought that she could be in the family tree of God's own son? Do you think God has plans for you too? Just like Rahab, we can trust God to have good plans for us – even amazing, earth changing plans!</p>	
25-30	<p>Pray and goodbye: Ask children for prayer requests. Allow individuals to pray – leader to close.</p>
