

# Leaders' Notes for Zoom meeting with Children's Groups

## Session 17

### Kingdom stories from Jesus : God's Kingdom is... Worth Everything!

#### Zoom Procedure:

- Leaders join Zoom first, and are last out. There must be at least two DBS holding adults leading. If a leader fails to join, as long as the present leader has a DBS, let in a parent and ask them to stay until another leader arrives.
- Children must have a parent with them on screen when they enter the zoom call. This then signifies consent and will be made clear in emails containing the zoom link. The parent need not stay after that.
- The zoom call mustn't be recorded.
- In all other ways comply with the existing church safeguarding policy.

#### Zoom Plan:

Timing	Activity	Notes
0-10	<p><b>Welcome:</b> Welcome question on powerpoint: What fun thing have you done this week? KS1 game: What is worth more? (At Argos) Children need a red and a blue item to show which of the items they think is more expensive. KS2 game: How much is it? Children use chat to type in a guess at the price of items.</p>	<p>Unmute all as children arrive – make visual contact with a parent. Then mute all and go round to hear children speak, unmuting one child at a time. Establish signal eg. hands up / hat on / finger on nose to speak during discussion.</p>
10-20	<p><b>Recap story:</b> KS1: Recap story using pictures from Nick Butterworth and Nick Inkpen's Precious Pearl on powerpoint followed by quick quiz on powerpoint: True / False answers – children show thumbs up or thumbs down. KS2: Recap story using stills from Stories from the kingdom by Scripture Union. Follow with quick quiz - Children use coloured objects to register answers.</p>	
20-25	<p><b>Discussion:</b> KS1: What is most valuable to you? Do you have a favourite toy? What food would you hate to never eat again? Why did the merchant sell all his stuff to buy the pearl? What is Jesus trying to explain?  KS2: What is most valuable to you? What is most important in your life? What is Jesus trying to explain when he said the two men gave everything to gain the treasure? What does this mean for us?</p>	
25-30	<p><b>Pray and goodbye:</b> Ask children for prayer requests. Allow individuals to pray – leader to close.</p>
