

# Leaders' Notes for Zoom meeting with Children's Groups

## God's Kingdom is... Kingdom Stories from Jesus Session 18: Worth Relying On

### Zoom Procedure:

- Leaders join Zoom first, and are last out. There must be at least two DBS holding adults leading. If a leader fails to join, as long as the present leader has a DBS, let in a parent and ask them to stay until another leader arrives.
- Children must have a parent with them on screen when they enter the zoom call. This then signifies consent and will be made clear in emails containing the zoom link. The parent need not stay after that.
- The zoom call mustn't be recorded.
- In all other ways comply with the existing church safeguarding policy.

### Zoom Plan:

Timing	Activity	Notes
0-10	<p><b>Welcome:</b> Welcome question on powerpoint: What fun thing have you done this week? KS1 game: Who am I quiz on powerpoint. Hands up to give answers. KS2 game: Who am I quiz on powerpoint – Type answers in chat box.</p>	Unmute all as children arrive – make visual contact with a parent. Then mute all and go round to hear children speak,
10-20	<p><b>Recap story:</b> Recap story using cartoon or stills on powerpoint (make sure younger children can join in with trumpets and shouts), followed by quick quiz on powerpoint: KS1: True / False answers – children show thumbs up or thumbs down. KS2: Children use coloured objects to register answers. This quiz reviews all 4 sessions.</p>	unmuting one child at a time. Establish signal eg. hands up / hat on / finger on nose to speak during discussion.
20-25	<p><b>Discussion:</b> KS1: Who was the best builder – why? Why is God like a rock? Is it easy or hard to rely on God? What helps us to do it?  KS2: Why did Jesus tell this story? Why is God like a rock, and what does this story mean for us? Can leaders tell of a time they have relied on God? Can the children?</p>	
25-30	<p><b>Pray and goodbye:</b> Ask children for prayer requests. Allow individuals to pray – leader to close.</p>
