<p>Day 14 Tues Mar 14<sup>th</sup></p>	<p><b>Jesus heals our brokenness</b>  Read John 4:1-38  This woman’s visit to the well at noon may have been to avoid others who would have gone there at the regular morning &amp; evening times. This suggests she was shunned by her community. Jesus reached out to her with the offer of soul-satisfying “living water” (see Psalm 36:9) – something only God can give. Jesus’ forgiveness washes us clean, his Spirit refreshes &amp; sustains us.  This is all part of the transformation of our lives that comes from being brought back into relationship with our heavenly Father. Once we were lost – but now we are found. We come to him with our brokenness, and find healing, wholeness &amp; peace.  Our past can tempt us to doubt our salvation. Remember whose we are. Nothing can ever snatch us out of his hands. (Romans 8:35-39)  Give Jesus thanks for the forgiveness &amp; wholeness we have in him. Thank him that the peace he gives “transcends all understanding” and guards our hearts and minds in him (Philippians 4:7). Talk to Jesus about those you know who need this understanding too.</p>
