<p>Day 25 Sat Mar 25th</p>	<p>Access - Jesus said “I am the way, the truth and the life” Read John 14:1-14 Jesus’ answer to Thomas’ question as to how to get to heaven wasn’t to outline a code of conduct, a way of living or actions to take but to invite us to know him. <i>Jesus is the Way.</i> He is the <i>only</i> way to know God, and only through Him can we come into the presence of his Father. Jesus has made that access possible – and as a result our lives are eternally secure. <i>Jesus said he is the Truth.</i> Our culture prizes tolerance and often confuses the idea of everyone having equal value with the idea that every truth-claim is equally valid. As the “Son of the living God” (Matt. 16:16), Jesus didn’t simply declare Himself to be the ultimate spiritual authority, he <i>proved</i> it with His death and resurrection. Truth to build our lives on. And <i>Jesus is the Life.</i> Within hours of speaking these words, Jesus, the source of all life, gave his life for us that we might find life. The nature of faith is that so much is unseen & unknown (e.g. the future) but the <i>basis</i> for faith in God is solid. If you can’t see a way forward, thank God that he knows all, and will be with you every step of the way.</p>
