<p>Day 29 Weds Mar 29th</p>	<p>Our response – reliance on his sufficient grace Read 2 Corinthians 12:1-10 Paul lets us in on a deep conversation he’d had with Jesus when Paul had asked for his “thorn in the flesh” to be removed. (Maybe this was a physical ailment?) Although Jesus didn’t remove this, he promised to demonstrate his power in Paul. This helps us immensely as we encounter struggles in our lives. We’re never promised a difficulty-free life – but we <i>are</i> promised God’s grace. If your life feels difficult right now, as well as looking ahead in faith to the future, make sure not to miss out on what he has for us to depend on in the now. God’s “sufficient” grace – amazingly, completely sufficient for whatever we face in this life. If you are sensing God’s call to step out in faith in a new way, Jesus’ promise of sufficient grace will be there as your future unfolds. Think of the magnitude of the inner strengthening from his glorious, unlimited resources (Ephesians 3:16). Every part of our lives can be built on his grace. Keep praying into the challenges we face. Keep praying for fresh vision & greater faith. He is close to all who call on him. Great is his faithfulness.</p>
